# Housing Counseling SPOTLIGHT

### **Adriana**

When Adriana move to Ohio from Houston, Texas in 2018, she rented a home where she felt there was no opportunity to personalize and grow. As issues with the home kept coming up and not getting fixed in a timely manor, Adriana decided it was time to buy a home of her own. Adriana soon realized that it was challenging to find a house that fit her needs.

"Its hard out there in housing."

While looking for a home that would serve as a base for her family, Adriana found a home built by YNDC. Through the buying process, Adriana went through YNDC's HUD-approved Housing Counseling Program, which she now recommends to anyone looking to purchase a home.

"Alex was very nice, talking about mortgage protection, making updates to the home in a year."

Adriana shared that the moneymanagement conversations were thorough and informative, and one of the main reasons why she shares the program with others.

## Shaquilla

As Shaquilla's rent continued to rise, she began to feel that it was finally time to purchase a home. Shaquilla searched for the perfect home, and as a first-time homebuyer, the task seemed overwhemling.

After seeing nearly 30 homes with a realtor, Shaquilla found the right home for her. A safe, new build, perfect for her and her family.

During the buying process, Shaquilla went through YNDC's HUD-approved Housing Counseling Program.

"Alex put into perspective how important it was to take preperatory steps. He solidified the importance of paying off certain loans and watching how I spend certain amounts during the buying process."

Shaquilla, now settled into her new home, encourages anyone looking to purchase their first home to go through the Housing Counseling Program.

"It is not an agressive thing. It is a lot of back and forth feedback looking at where you are now and how to get where you need to be. It was a lot of 'let's try this and see if we can achieve this result in this timeline'. It was relaxed, but it is real help."



## MAHONING COUNTY LAND BANK HOMES



YNDC continues making progress with new housing construction. In June, YNDC, in partnership with Mahoning County Land Bank, completed six new homes on Mineral Springs Avenue, and currently has 22 additional single family homes under construction, the first of which will be completed in the next month.













# NEW CONSTRUCTION GLENWOOD DUPLEXES PHASE 2



YNDC completed construction on three new duplexes on Glenwood Avenue this quarter. Each duplex holds two, two-bedroom, two-bathroom apartments that are available for rent to qualified tenants. Each apartment features in-unit laundry, a spacious open concept living area, and kitchen fully equipped with a fridge, range, and microwave range hood.

The completion of these duplexes marks the end of Phase 2 of Glenwood Duplex development, with a total of five duplexes now housing tenants on Glenwood Avenue.

The units are energy efficient and all electric with net zero energy usage, producing their own electricity via solar panels. More energy is produced on site than used by the buildings.



### **Vivian**



# OWNER-OCCUPIED HOME REPAIR SPOTLIGHT

Lorraine shared that during the winter months especially, not having hot water started to take its toll. After a smooth installation process, Lorraine says her new hot water tank works wonderfully.

"I can take hot showers now. That's definitely good."

### Ned

Ned's 110-year-old porch was slanted and falling apart, leading to safety concerns for anyone who had to cross the porch to reach his front door. His front door did not close properly and was challenging to lock.

A neighbor told Ned about YNDC's Essential Repair program, and Ned was able to recieve both a new porch and new front door through that program.

"It was very exciting. The guys that did it were just so meticulous. They made it perfect. That was their goal. I feel so much safer now that my door is fixed. I feel secure, you know. I am not embarassed to hear about the porch looking so bad. I feel blessed because I could never afford something like that."







## NEIGHBORHOOD ENGAGEMENT & ORGANIZING



YNDC's Community Engagement Team has visited 2,756 unique households to date to collect feedback from residents about how they feel their neighborhood is doing and what they would like to see improve in the coming years in the Greater Glenwood Avenue area, which consists of multiple neighborhoods between High Street, West Midlothian, Market Street, and Mill Creek Park. YNDC has collected detailed feedback from over 150 households thus far, and anticipates receiving responses from about 250 households by the time we are finished visiting all households two times. The data will be used to inform the strategies for improving neighborhood conditions in the Greater Glenwood Area Plan.















## NEIGHBORHOOD CLEANUP



YNDC completed significant cleanup and brush clearance to the former Buckeye Elementary School site in the 7th Ward in partnership with the Buckeye Plat Neighborhood Association in order to assist the group with grassroots efforts to transform this vacant lot into a passive neighborhood park which will include a walking trail and picnic areas for neighbors.

YNDC also cleared brush and overgrowth from sidewalks along East High Street and Lansdowne Boulevard in the 2nd Ward in preparation for installing new sidewalks along Lansdowne Boulevard this coming Spring. A stretch of Lansdowne Boulevard from East High Street to Adelaide Avenue lacks sidewalks, which has forced East High School students to walk in the street on their way to and from school. New sidewalks will be built where they are missing in the Spring to connect East High School safely to Oak Street and the surrounding neighborhoods.

YNDC is removing hazardous trees, cleaning and greening vacant lots,and installing new sidewalks in neighborhoods throughout the city where we are building and renovating homes as part of the Neighborhood Improvements program in partnership with the City of Youngstown. Dozens of hazardous trees will be removed from vacant lots and tree lawns, and well over a mile of sidewalks replaced by the time work is complete during the next quarter.

# MAHONING VALLEY TREECORPS

This quarter, YNDC focused on removing dead and hazardous street trees in neighborhoods across the city as part of Mahoning Valley TreeCorps. In total, YNDC will have removed 1,223 dead and hazardous street trees across the city from tree lawns and public greenspaces as work concludes by the end of the year. Youngstown has thousands of dead, dying, and dangerous shade trees in tree lawns and public spaces. These trees are not only unsightly but pose real danger to adjacent residents as well as adjacent homes, power lines and buildings. Removal of dead and hazardous trees has long been a priority for residents, and this generational investment in tree canopy management will help the City of Youngstown's forestry crew to catch up with the problem. As part of Mahoning Valley TreeCorps, YNDC and its partners will replace these trees by planting nearly 5 times as many public shade trees as have been removed, helping to restore the city's tree-lined streets for the next generation.









# **COMUNITY**SAFETY PROGRAM



YNDC has installed 387 doorbell cameras so far this year in multiple neighborhoods throughout the city as part of the Community Safety Program. This quarter, outreach and camera installations focused on neighborhoods in the 2nd Ward on Youngstown's East Side as well as on blocks throughout Youngstown where YNDC is building and renovating housing.

YNDC also installed 39 bright dusk -to-dawn LED security lights on businesses and adjacent public spaces along Glenwood Avenue to improve safety along the corridor. YNDC will be installing security lighting along additional corridors including McCartney Road, Market Street, Midlothian Boulevard, and Mahoning Avenue in the coming months.








# **CORRIDOR**IMPROVEMENTS





YNDC is currently working with 22 local businesses on Market Street, Midlothian Boulevard, McCartney Road, and Mahoning Avenue to make exterior improvements to their properties that will eliminate outstanding exterior code issues, improve lighting and safety in the public spaces around the businesses, and enhance curb appeal for their properties. This is part of a coordinated effort in partnership with the City of Youngstown to improve curb appeal and support businesses on Youngstown's neighborhood business corridors. YNDC is working to obtain cost estimates and improvements are set to begin in the next quarter.


